

Faith – In what?

"Now faith is <u>confidence</u> in what we hope for and <u>assurance</u> about what we do not see." – Hebrews 11:1. The writer of Hebrews provided insight to Jesus' response to Thomas when he put his hand in His side. Jesus said, "Because you have seen Me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." - John 20:29.

Discussion time:

Faith is:

<u>Confidence</u> in what we hope for - God being at work in all things; Strength in Christ; Relationship with Christ; His will for our lives; and relevance for the word of God in this world.

<u>Assurance</u> about what we do not see - Existence of Heaven & hell; empowerment through the resurrected Christ; indwelling of the Holy Spirit; forgiveness; Way, Truth & Life; and Jesus' return.

While we may know what faith *is*, the tendency is to put faith *in* other things - in the ability to perform; in friendships; in a doctor's opinion; in the person driving next to us on the road; in family. Faith in such things will disappoint.

Dad - Discuss what you have put your faith in. **Family** - How has your parents' faith influenced you?

Dad - Discuss what you have placed confidence in. **Family** - What assurance have you received physically or emotionally.

Family - Discuss how you can keep this dialogue going.
