

GIFTS: What Makes You, You

Scripture theme: "There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them." – 1Corinthians 12:4. While Paul is referencing spiritual gifts in this passage, throughout scripture there is discussion around the uniqueness of each individual and how each are to glorify God in that uniqueness.

Dad - <u>Underline</u> a rating on the level of focus your dad exemplified in helping you identify and nurture your unique gifts:

Student - Circle a rating on the level of focus your dad exemplifies today for each category. (Dad - encourage honesty and listen well to the ratings. Accept affirmation and steer clear of being defensive.)

Dad - Give a specific example on where you rated your dad *high*, and another where the rating is *low* or *so-so*.

Student - Do the same.

Discussion time:

Gifts are what make you, you. You have been given unique gifts & traits that you are to take responsibility for. They give you purpose in this world as well as an opportunity to glorify God throughout your life.

Dad & Student - Discuss what giftedness has shaped your life to this point. Who has been an influence/inspiration in this area of your life?

Student - What specific interests & abilities have you been encouraged to pursue? Are you accepting responsibility for those gifts?

Dad - How are you glorifying God through gifts He has given you? Share a glimpse of His glory that you have experienced on the journey.

Dad - Share a personal story of how your dad, or someone close to you encouraged or failed to encourage you in gifts you were given and the impact that had on you.

Dad & Student - Discuss how you can keep this dialogue going.
