



## Father's Day Challenge

**THIS FATHER'S DAY, June 20<sup>th</sup>, 2021, I commit as a *faithful father* to move forward with a New Perspective gleaned from what has been experienced as a family across this past year. I will:**

- 1. Prioritize my physical presence** in the home and with family. *'In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning ... The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us.'* John 1:1-2, 14. Just as God provided a connection with Him through the physical presence of His Son, a father provides a connection to the Father by being present and accounted for in family. We have experienced more time together as a family as outside activities got cancelled. I have a new perspective on the value of this time and **I will** be intentional to continue prioritizing physical presence.
- 2. Be engaged emotionally** with my wife and kids. *'If you love Me, you will obey what I command. And I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Counselor to be with you forever – the Spirit of Truth.'* – John 14:15-17. Jesus anticipated emotional distractions long before 150 cable channels, i-phones, texting, radio and newspapers, not to mention other worries, frustrations and discouragement that came with the pandemic. Across this past year, we did engage better as a family when a number of distractions, especially the busy-ness of calendars chock-full of activities, were eliminated. **I will** step forward with a New Perspective for emotional engagement, especially at the dinner table, with a focus on the Counselor.
- 3. Lead spiritually by example.** *'Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord.'* – Ephesians 6:2. One positive around watching church services online 'During Covid' has been the spiritual discussion that has happened in real time with the kids. I was busted because I have fallen short as the spiritual leader in my home. **I will** continue the momentum by discussing the pastor's sermon and scripture passage as a family. I will also utilize a ConnectCard, Devotions for Dads book or other devotion material weekly to initiate more spiritual discussion in the home.
